34% of users say they or their family are from a Black, Asian, or Minority Ethnic group

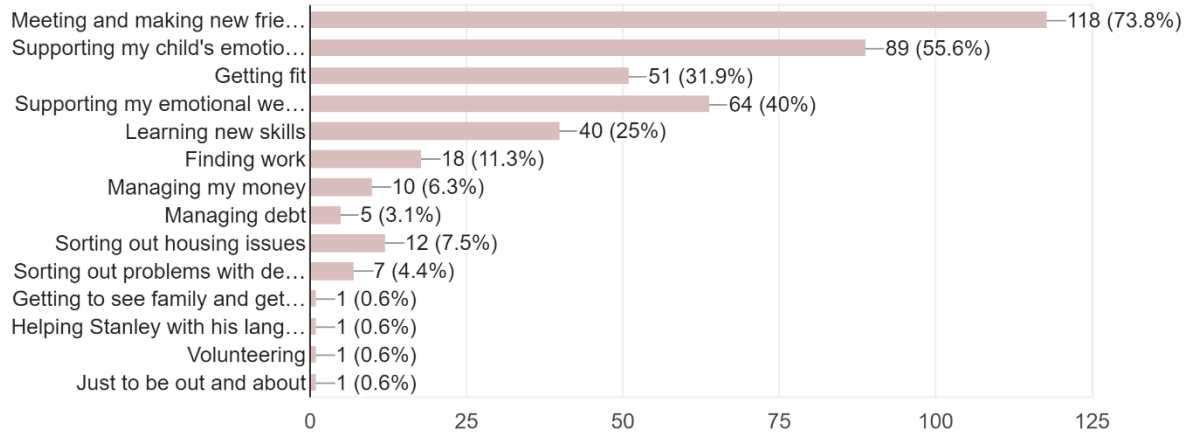
12% of our users report needing English Language support

6% of our users are concerned that their child may not be as physically active as they should be due to lockdown

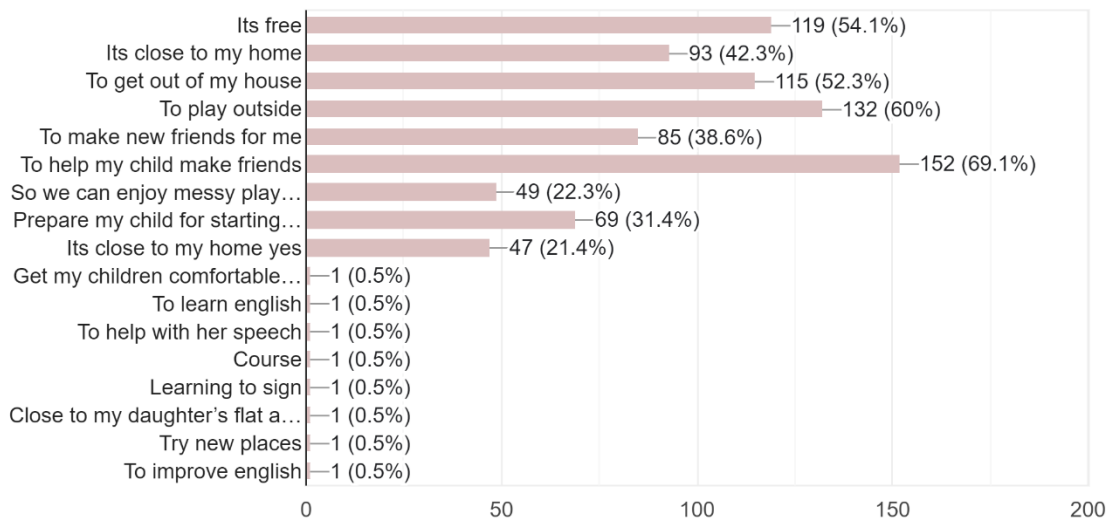
Thinking about where your family is now following the pandemic what are the three biggest needs your family has at the current time?

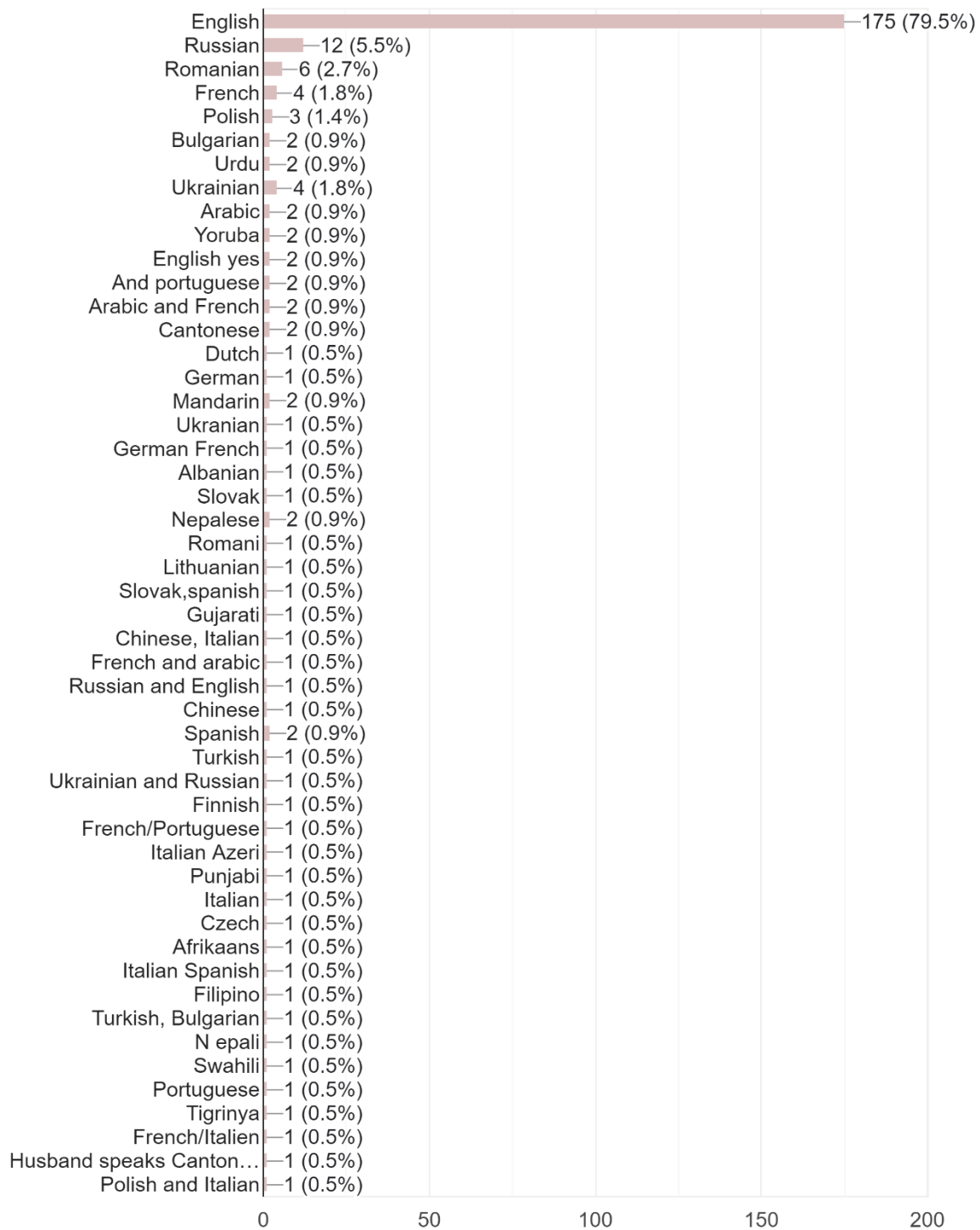
Why have you come to The Big Red Bus Club today? Please tick all that apply

Ukrainian Stay and Play 01.08.22 – 31.07.23

57 Unique additional families since 01.08.23 We have over 107 Unique Ukrainian families registered with our service.

35 Sessions held.

3 trips and outreach events (seaside, museum, Greenwich Park picnic)

Average attendance per session: 18 Adults and 18 children with highs over the summer of 35 adults and 44 children.

Approximately 40% on average of attendees at each session were Ukrainians who had arrived since the 22.02.22

Play Plus SEND service

30 Unique new families

66% had not seen a Speech and language therapist

90% of children had started or made significant progress across the year across the following outcomes:

Increase the number of social contacts and interactions with under five SEND peers & Support the child's wellbeing and mental health through a range of fun activities (significant, started, none)

Improve child development through increased exposure to educational SEND activities

Strengthen child transition to future settings through development opportunities and exposure to a range of communication activities
